

# **Fare Mitigation Program**

Honored Citizen (Low Income Fare Program)

- 50% price off 2½-hour tickets & day passes \$1.25/ride and \$2.50/day
- 72% off monthly pass \$28.00

# Impact of Fare Capping (Hop Card)


- Per trip cost declines once monthly cap is met
  - ~\$0.70 per boarding for 5 weekday roundtrips over the course of a month
  - ~\$0.50 per boarding for 7 round trips over the course of a month



# **Fare Mitigation Program**

Low Income Fare Program (part of Honored Citizen Program)

- 56,422 enrollments all time
- 21,839 active enrollments
- +14.8% since 2022; +85.9% since 2020

### Fare Relief Program

• \$6.9 mil in subsidized fare provided in FY23 (combined STIF and General Fund)



# Fare Mitigation Program

### **Student Fares**

- \$693,244 in student fares in FY23
- \$825,000 allocated for FY24
- 12 school districts participating

### Summer Pass Program

- \$2.9 mil allocated in Summer 2023
- \$3.3 mil used
- ~364,000 Summer Pass taps



### TriMet Equity Areas

The Transit Equity Index scoring regimen compiles, normalizes, scores, and integrates ten demographic indicators of Title VI and low-income populations summarized by Census block groups into a composite index to identify locations of high equity needs in the three-county region. Block groups scoring in the top quartile of the index are classified as Equity Areas.

- Equity Area Top 25th Percentile
- Not Equity Area Below 25th
  Percentile





### Construction

East Burnside – BAT lane & signal improvement

### Bid Process (begins Nov. 4th)

• SW 4<sup>th</sup> Ave. – bus only lane – Sheridan to Caruthers

### Design

- Alder Phase II curb extension / new shelter
- West Burnside design work underway

### Planning

Project selection (equity & geographic distribution) – early



# **Bus Stop Amenities Program**

### Challenges

- Vendor: delivered faulty shelters
- Installer: performance problems
- Vandalism:
  - \$200,000 in glass replacement
  - Replaced 62 large glass panels & purchased 500 replacement panels
  - New shelter design

### Successes

- 3 new shelters and benches
- 23 ADA bus stop pads in FY22-23
- E-paper readers
  - 129 installed in FY22-23
  - 303 total installed to day
  - 407 installed at end of FY24
  - Vandal shields






### **Portland's Streetcar System**

- Three routes serving Portland's Central City
- 19 vehicles and 70 stations
- Average Weekday ridership ~ 8,000/day
- Since 2001 (within ¼ mile of streetcar)
  - 50% of all housing in Portland built
  - 40% of all affordable housing constructed
  - >\$13.7 billion in market value created
- Today (within 1/4 mile of streetcar)
  - 39% of all regulated affordable housing
  - 27% of Portland's jobs





### Portland's Streetcar System - 2023 Highlights

- > STIF revenues used to continue daily operations
- Received two of the three new Brookville Streetcar Vehicles (pictured)
- Continued award-winning Rider Ambassador Program
- New customer signs at stations being installed now
