STFAC Vote One

Should Projected Unused FY23 STF funds be returned to their original applicants for the projects designated in STF applications are or returned and applied towards all applicants projects



STFAC Vote Two

- Established in 1985 these funds are distributed to 42 designated agencies based on population. Emphasizes services for seniors and people with disabilities of any age
- Designed to be flexible, coordinated, reliable, and continuing source of revenue originally funded with cigarette tax, ID card revenue, other funds as directed.

5310 Funding Review

- Goal of funds is to improve mobility for seniors and individuals with disabilities living and traveling throughout Oregon.
- The FTA allocates Section 5310 funds to states (ODOT) which distribute to transportation agencies and providers. The final amount of 5310 funds will be announced in October.

In the Fiscal Year 24/25 Biennium the Projected 5310 Funds to be distributed by the STFAC is:

\$7,450,000






STIF Elderly and Disabled Funding Review

- Funded primarily through a Payroll Tax. Separate funding designated in TriMet's Statewide Transportation Improvement Fund Grant.
- This portion of designated STIF funds must be used for services for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities

Distribution Methodology

- Should a focus be placed on funding current existing programs first to insure no services lost?
- Should new programs be funded first or with remaining and available funds?
- Should FY22/23 plus inflation be the base for funding existing programs be?



Distribution Methodology

Ask Vs Inflation Explained

If existing project is asking for an increase in FY24/25 the equation for funding will be:

FY22/23 Award amount + Inflation Increase

(FY24/25 Request X Inflation Percentage) + FY24/25 Request

If existing project is requesting less than FY22/23 amount:

- If an existing program is requesting less than amount received in FY22/23 they will receive requested amount.
- The STFAC will need to decide on the inflation percentage and if program has asked for less than the FY22/23 funding level then that request will be honored.
